Liberal Democrats Demand Better for You

Education

- Work with schools to ensure every child is taught in a school judged to be good or outstanding by OFSTED
- Work to ensure our schools offer a range of after school activities for young people
- Work to achieve the goal of guaranteeing a job, a training place or further education place for all 18-24 olds.



Law and order

• Tackle crime using prevention as the best approach. Our Police should work closely with local communities, schools, voluntary and local government organisations.



- Ensure a zero tolerance of child sexual exploitation through a public awareness campaign to increase early awareness
- Make use of Public Space Protection Orders to tackle irresponsible dog owners.

Housing - young priced out

- The Lib Dems call for a rapid increase in homebuilding especially on brown field sites and in the City Centre. Future homes should be energy efficient and affordable to run whether you rent or buy.
- Young people are being priced out of the housing market by Tory housing policy. The Tory West Midlands Mayor plans to build 215,000 new homes by 2030. But just 20% will be affordable. That's around 2,000 per year and how many of these will be for rent?". Lib Dems want the target for affordable homes be increased to at least 35%..



Culture, Arts, Sports and Leisure

• Activities for pre-school children and their parents all the way to groups for our older citizens.



• Accessible play, sports and leisure facilities including outdoor gyms, safe play for the youngest and more challenging recreation for older children.

Transport

- Extend and improve the Midland Metro Tram network, particularly to New Cross Hospital, Bentley Bridge, Wednesfield and potentially farther to complete the proposed "5 Ws" extension to Willenhall and Walsall and Wednesbury.
- Fight to provide a continuous network of green pathways and cycle ways to encourage more people to walk or cycle to work.
